

Canoe Brook Center Senior Bus Transportation (203)315-0681

Canoe Brook Center has three busses, two 18 passenger busses and one 12 passenger bus that are driven by CDL licensed bus drivers employed part-time by the Town of Branford. There is no charge to use our transportation services, however donations are appreciated.

Passengers must be Branford residents age 60+, oriented, ambulatory and independent. Our busses have three steps that must be climbed to enter the bus; you must be able to enter the vehicle unassisted. Service is curb-to-curb. Should you need hands on assistance or wheelchair transportation call Greater New Haven Transit District's MyRide at 288-6282 as they provide wheelchair transport to qualifying Branford residents.

Reservations can be made by calling our transportation office (203) 315-0681 at least one day in advance. All new passengers will be evaluated prior to booking a ride.

For errands around Town we will pick you up at your home take you where you need to go according to the following schedule:

Canoe Brook: for activities, lunch, and trips: Monday through Friday

Banks: Wednesday, Thursday

Pharmacy: Wednesday, Thursday

Grocery shopping:

Stop & Shop: Tues. & Fri. 8:30am

Big Y: Tues. & Fri. at 11:30am

Where you live determines which store we will take you to. You have approximately 1.5 hours to shop, you must be able to carry your groceries into your home. Drivers are not allowed to enter your home.

Branford Medical Transportation (203)315-0681

Medical Transportation is available to Branford residents 21 years of age or older. We have a fleet of sedans that are provided by the Town of Branford. Cars are driven by a team of volunteer drivers. You must be able to get in and out of the car unassisted. Service is curb-to-curb. All vehicles are equipped with two-way radios systems.

Transportation is provided to doctors' offices in Branford, East Haven, New Haven, Guilford, and the VA. The earliest appointment that can be made to see a doctor is **8:45 am**; the last appointment is **2:00 pm** (1:00 pm New Haven) you must be ready for a return ride home by **3:00 pm**.

Reservations: Call (203)315-0681 a minimum of 5 days prior to your appointment. Our schedule fills up fast and we may not always be able to accommodate your request so —book early! All new passengers will be evaluated prior to booking a ride.

Olsen Shoreline Transport: (203)488-1888 Transportation between New Haven and Old Saybrook. Accepts Medicaid (Title 19).

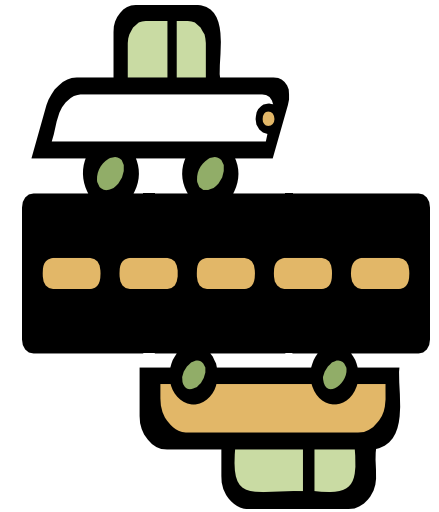
****BAD WEATHER POLICY****

For the safety of our passengers and our drivers we will be unable to transport you in the event of bad weather. When a storm is predicted we will call you the day before to inform you we have cancelled all transportation services, allowing you time to make other arrangements or to reschedule your appointment. Occasionally we have no warning about weather conditions and must pull vehicles off the road on short notice. It is your responsibility to have a back up person to transport you if Branford Medical Transportation is unable to get you to, or home, from your appointment due to unanticipated weather conditions. This is critically important for those passengers that we transport to dialysis or chemotherapy. (Please arrange back up transportation with a family member, friend, neighbor or church group, before scheduling an appointment with us.) Thank you for your understanding and cooperation with this policy.
