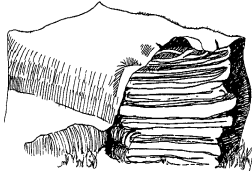


Where should my paper go?



Newspapers along with **magazines, catalogs,** and inserts go in a brown paper grocery bag



then go in the newspaper cart, barrel, newspaper dumpster or blue box at your condominium, or in the blue recycling box if the Town picks up your recyclables.

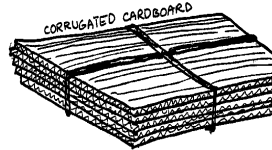


Corrugated Cardboard



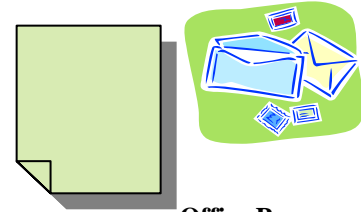
(empty)

and put next to your recycling container
or

if the Town picks up your recyclables, then save it for large cardboard day and then you don't even have to flatten it! (still must be empty though)
Branford now accepts clean cereal boxes, paper towel rolls, & tissue boxes, including "paperboard" and "boxboard" on large cardboard day pickup!

Recycling is optional for residents but must be recycled by businesses



For residents we can't collect it at the curb (don't want it wet!) but you may, and are encouraged to, drop it off at the transfer station because...

We've Just Expanded What We Can Take!

We've always taken **white paper** dropped off at the Transfer station because it's on the state list of mandatory recyclables. But we also take **colored paper, envelopes** even with windows, and now take **glossy paper**, as long as it's not a magazine or catalog, so most of the other junk mail can be dropped off for recycling with office paper. Sorting just got easier, too: don't worry about paper clips, staples, Post-it ® notes, or rubber bands! For complete details, check our web site at www.Branford-CT.gov

It goes to the Bristol Resource Recovery Facility to be burned to make electricity. That's one reason why you shouldn't put things in the garbage like metal, glass, wallboard, or household hazardous wastes.
