BOARD OF FINANCE MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, MAY 22, 2017

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BRANFORD TOWN CLERK

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Joseph Mooney at 7:30 p.m. at Fire Headquarters, 45 North Main Street. Board of Finance members present were: Victor Cassella, Ken Kaminsky, Lorraine Young, Charles Shelton and Jeffrey Vailette. Also in attendance were First Selectman Jamie Cosgrove, Finance Director Jim Finch and Town Clerk Lisa Arpin. RTM reps in attendance were Robert Imperato; Ray Ingraham arrived at 9:15 p.m.

- 1. Chairman Mooney requested approval of the minutes of the April 24, 2017 meeting. Mr. Shelton made the motion, seconded by Ms. Young. Vote unanimous.

- 3. The Board heard a presentation from Tim Ryor of Hooker & Holcombe regarding the actuarial valuations for the Police and Volunteer Fire pension plans.
- 4. The Board heard an overview presentation of the Town's volunteer police pension fund by GYL Financial Synergies and Hightower Advisors for the quarter ended March 31, 2017. Charles Andriole, Michael LePore and Robert DeLucca touched on highlights. A recommendation to rebalance \$147K to cash was made. 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15. Chairman Mooney read the resolution:

"RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$6,000,000 FOR THE TOWN OF BRANFORD TOWN-WIDE ENERGY CONSERVATION AND MODERNIZATION PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF \$6,000,000 BOND, LEASE OR OTHER FINANCING OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE"

and to recommend the resolution for adoption by the Representative Town Meeting.

Representatives from Honeywell (Doreen Hamilton, Lisa Montalto and Zachary Loya, and from ECG Engineering, Aldo Mazzaferro) made an extensive presentation of the Town's energy expenditures analysis by building and presented a self-funding proposal, including a discussion on energy rebates. Mr. Finch and First Selectman Cosgrove added additional input. The item was tabled until 5/30/17 by a motion by Mr. Vailette, seconded by Mr. Shelton, and no action was taken pending additional information to demonstrate the \$6,000,000 in expenditures (i.e. list of projects, proforma cash flow, revenue and savings, guarantee document.)

- 16. Chairman Mooney discussed concerns regarding the State budget and the impact on Branford, and the challenges of setting the mill rate on 5/30/17 without knowing the full impacts on the Town, while insulating the taxpayers from the impact of uncertainties in Hartford. First Selectman Cosgrove and Mr. Finch gave additional comments.
- 17. Chairman Mooney requested to adjourn the meeting at 10:11 p.m. Mr. Cassella made the motion, seconded by Mr. Kaminsky. The vote was unanimous.
