Organize and Catalog a list of recommended project <u>actions</u>

John Hoefferle, Town Engineer, has requested that the CVWG comb thru the 2016 Plan, the YSFE study, the Branford Hazard Mitigation, and the SCROG Regional Framework for Coastal Resilience and develop a coherent "database" of recommended projects and actions. This would start as a simple spreadsheet and expand into a true database in the future. This Chair is working on an outline of the elements of information to be collected for each project action.
