


Dear Jamie:

The snow problem is one of the many things that the church took care of when we had regularly 450-475 members. Now we are struggling to maintain 50-60 regular attendees on Sony given Sunday. As an example at the recent memorial service for a long time member Carol Tiltcomb (whose husband Neil provided the forwarded information about snow removal) and we had 435 people in attendance. Our sexton does labor only within the church, is slightly intellectually challenged and does well within well defined parameters. Neil has been on top of needed repairs in the church and is a top notch handler of some of our major problems: oversight roof/ furnace/kitchen appliances/sound systems, etc etc but cannot be responsible for exterior work nor for snow removal. Remember the church is responsible for the donation of the land that the three churches and Town Hall currently occupy.

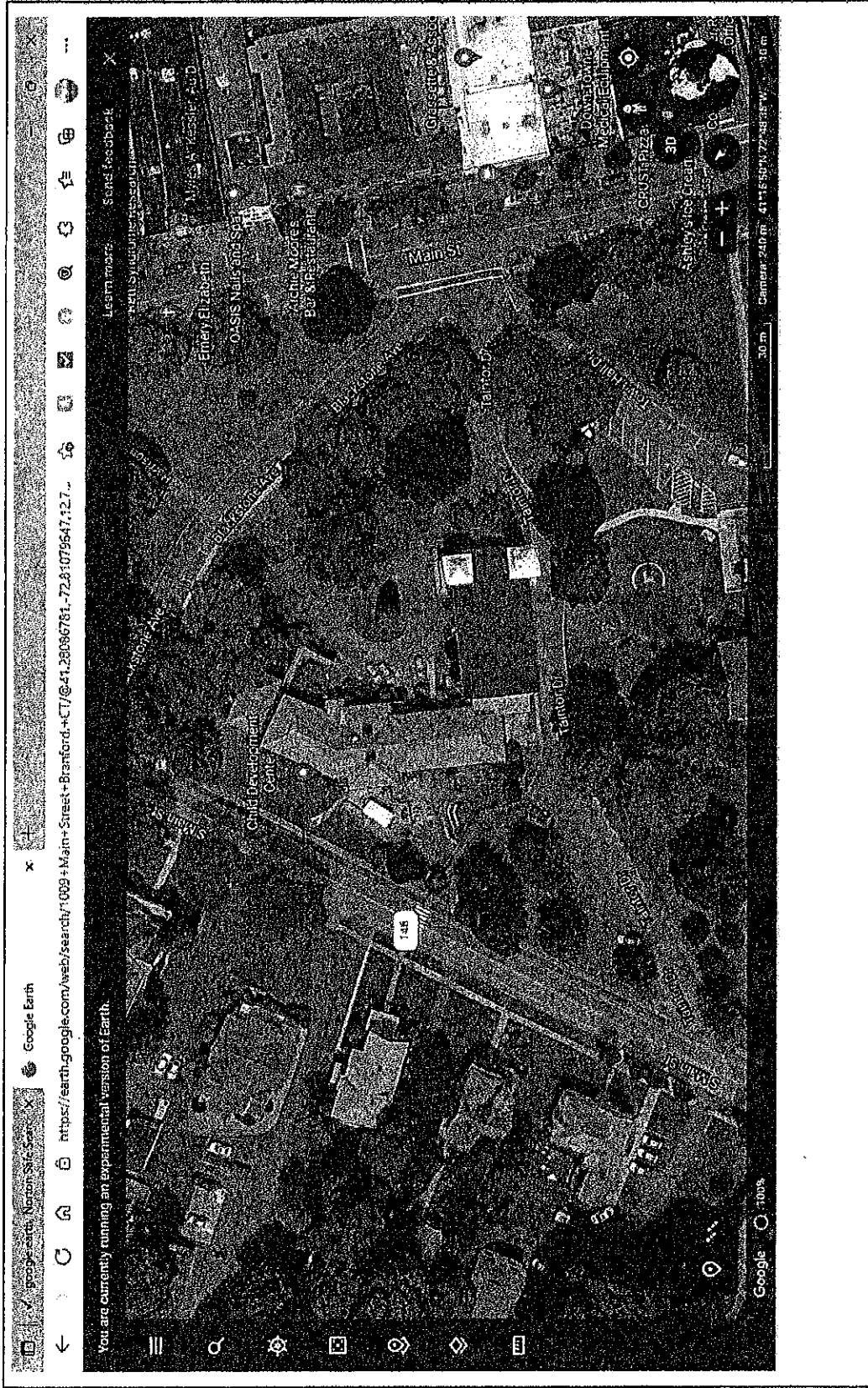
I ran into Jamie outside Town Hall this morning. We had quite a productive chat and I am looking forward to discussing it with you.

First Congregational Church – 1009 Main Street Branford, CT Snow Removal Requirements



First Congregational Church snow removal/sanding requirements have two components.

1. Child Development Center (CDC) access to lower level of the Church. Hours 6 am to 5 pm.
 - a. Taintor Drive parking. Town is supposed to plow Taintor Drive.
 - b. Stairwell from Taintor Drive to covered doorway entrance and concrete landing nearest Taintor Drive.
 - c. Side walk width from covered doorway entrance nearest Taintor Drive through nearest playground gate to covered doorway in playground. This is required as a fire exit for the CDC.
 - d. Side walk width from covered doorway at west end of playground through gate to South Main Street sidewalk. This is required as a fire exit for the CDC.
 - e. Sidewalks west end of building. These are required as a fire exit for the CDC.
 - i. Door on South Main Street side around end of building to parking circle.
 - ii. Sidewalk width from All Purpose Room Double door to sidewalk.
 - iii. Sidewalk from Blackstone Avenue sidewalk to sidewalk nearest to All Purpose Room.
2. Church access. Hours Monday to Friday 8 am to 5 pm. Sunday 8:30 am to noon.
 - a. Paved surface from Taintor Drive past front stairs of Church Sanctuary back to Taintor Drive. (Around triangle raised area.)
 - b. Paved parking circle surface west side of Church Sanctuary.
 - c. Front stairs and handicap ramp of Church Sanctuary.
 - d. Both Handicap ramps from parking circle to building.
 - e. Paved surface from parking circle to Office entrance.
 - f. Sidewalk on East side of Church Sanctuary.

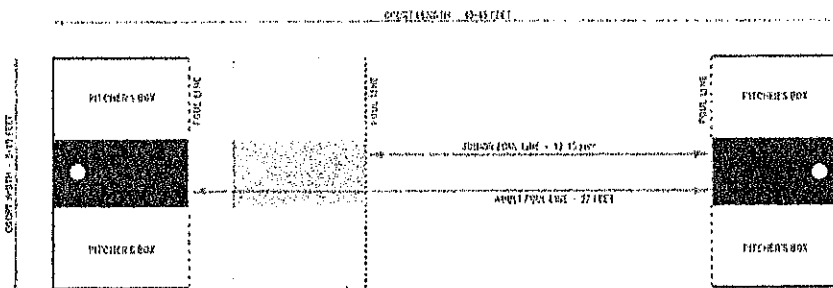
Hello First Selectman Cosgrove,

The following is an overview of my plans for establishing a new annual fundraiser for the nonprofit Orchard House Medical Adult Day Center annual fundraiser in the Branford Green.

With yours, and all parties' permissions, I would like to develop an annual fundraiser for the Orchard House starting on Saturday July 9, 2022, where I/we implement the 1st Annual Branford Cornhole Tournament. The game Cornhole is a very popular game for all ages and Cornhole is for everyone.

This fundraiser (official name could be 'The 1st Annual Branford Cornhole Tournament on the Branford Green) will take place on a Saturday or Sunday, start in the morning and end in the evening after the last game finishes, with an after party/trophy ceremony at a place like Donovan's Reef. Here is a brief overview of this \$10,000 fundraiser I am thinking of and I welcome your thoughts:

- 100 teams of 4 competing by eliminations; \$100 donation per team to play
- 50 games played at once and slowly whittle down to one winner
- Below is the size of each court – 50 can easily fit on the Branford Green and not hurt the grass



- One Trophy created and handed out to the winner after the event at possibly Donovan's.
- I already secured a title sponsor – Richlin in Branford committed \$2,500 to sponsor this event

2 Food trucks, live acoustic music, and Dennis Nardella will be hired to keep things flowing and fun.

Overview of the Game

THE COURT LAYOUT

DIMENSIONS

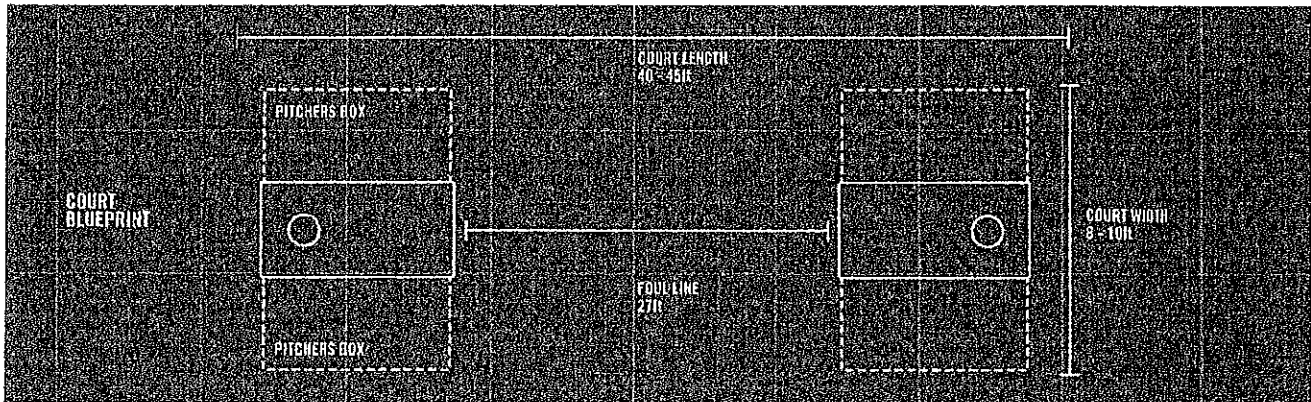
A cornhole court shall be a level rectangular area 8-10 feet wide and a minimum of 40-45 feet long. The court should consist of two cornhole boards, designated pitcher's boxes, and foul lines.

PITCHER'S BOX

The pitcher's box is the rectangle 4 feet by 3 feet at each end of the court, parallel with, and on both sides of the boards. Each player must remain in the pitcher's box while pitching a cornhole bag.

FOUL LINES

There are two sets of foul lines: (1) open adult-play and (2) junior-play (12 and under). The open adult-play foul lines shall be defined as an imaginary line 27 feet between the front of each board. The junior-play foul lines shall be defined as an imaginary line 12-15 feet between the front of each board. With regard to sets that meet ACA specifications, the foul line will be parallel to the front of the board.



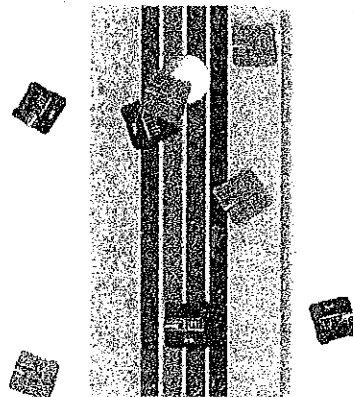

STANDARDS FOR CORNHOLE BOARDS AND BAGS

The ACA has adopted the following equipment specifications and standards:

1. Each board shall be a 47.5 to 48 inch by 23.5 to 24 inch rectangle made of plywood that is at least a 0.5 inch thick. ACA sanctioned cornhole tournaments should only be played with wooden boards, as there is significant variance in play between wooden, plastic, and other surfaces.
2. The hole in the board shall be 6 inches in diameter. Its center shall be 9 inches from the top and 12 inches from each side of the board edges.
3. The front of the board shall be 3-4 inches from bottom to top.
4. The back of the board shall be approximately 12 inches from ground to the highest point of the deck.
5. The board finish shall be sanded to a very smooth texture, and there shall not be any blemishes in the wood surface that might disrupt or distort play.
6. The board can be painted with a semi-gloss exterior latex paint resulting in a surface that allows bags to slide, but is not so slippery that it allows the bags to slide back down the board.

7. The cornhole bags shall be made from two fabric squares 6.25" x 6.25" with a 0.25" stitched seam on all four sides. Bags should be made from durable fabric. Each bag shall be filled with approximately 2 cups of feed corn and finished bags should be roughly 6" x 6" and weigh 14-16 ounces. We will allow the use of plastic pellets (All Weather Cornhole Bags) in lieu of feed corn.



PLAY OF THE GAME

SINGLES OR DOUBLES PLAY

Every match is broken down into innings of play. During an inning of play, each player must pitch all four of his/her bags. An inning is never completed until all players pitch all four of his/her bags.

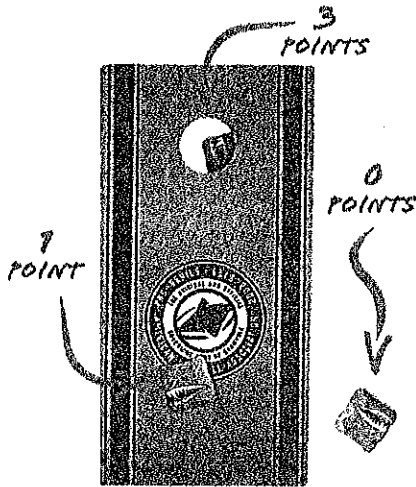
Singles Play - Player A competes against Player B.

1. Both players stay in their designated lane for the whole game.
2. Players start the game at the headboard and will alternate pitching bags until each player has pitched all four of his/her bags.
3. Players then walk to the end of their lane to the other court, take score, and resume pitching back to the other board.
4. The top of an inning is completed when the first player pitches all four bags; the bottom of the inning is completed when the remaining player pitches all four bags.

Doubles Play - Team A competes against Team B; each team is comprised of two people.

1. Each team will stay in their designated lane for the whole game.

2. Players at the headboard will alternate pitching bags until each player has pitched all four of his/her bags.
3. Players at the footboard will take score and resume pitching back to the other board.
4. The top of an inning is completed when both players pitching from the headboard pitch all four bags; the bottom of the inning is completed when the remaining players pitching from the footboard pitch all four bags.



VALUE OF THE BAG

The approved method of scoring for the sport of cornhole is "cancellation" scoring. In cancellation scoring, the points of one player cancel out the points of their opponent. Using this method, only one player/team can score in each inning.

Bag In-The-Count (Woody) : Any bag which comes to rest anywhere on top of the board. Each is worth one (1) point.

Bag In-The-Hole (Cornhole) : Any bag which is thrown through the hole or knocked through the hole by another bag. Each is worth three (3) points.

Foul Bags - Refers to any bag that has not been determined as Bag In-The-Count or Bag In-The-Hole or was designated a foul bag as the result of rules violation.

PITCHING ROTATION DURING THE GAME

The player or team who scored in the preceding inning has honor pitching first in the next inning. If neither player or team scores, the player or team who pitched first in the preceding frame shall retain first pitch in the next frame.

POSITION OF PLAYERS DURING PITCHING

1. The pitcher must be within the pitcher's box or behind the foul line at the time of release.
2. A player must pitch all four bags from their designated pitcher's box.
3. Players must pitch the bag with an under-hand release.



FOUL BAGS

1. The following are rule violations that must be spotted and called by a player or assigned judge. The penalty is to declare the bag a foul bag, which requires the bags to be removed from the court prior to resuming play.

A foul bag is defined as:

- (a) Any bag pitched when the player has (1) made contact with or crossed over the foul line, or (2) started or stepped completely outside the pitcher's box before the bag is released.
- (b) Any bag not delivered within the 20-second time limit.
- (c) A bag pitched from a different pitcher's box than the first bag.
- (d) Any bag that contacted the court or the ground before coming to rest on the board.
- (e) Any bag that struck a previously defined object such as a tree limb, wire, indoor court ceiling, etc.
- (f) Any bag on the board that is also touching the ground.
- (g) Any bag removed from the board before scoring has been agreed upon for that bag.
 - (i). The offending team (who touches the bags) forfeits all remaining bags and tallies the score of just the bags thrown before the foul was reported.
 - (ii). The non-offending team tallies twelve (12) points as if they had thrown four Bag In-The-Holes (Cornholes) during the inning.

2. A bag that leaves a player's hand once the final forward swing of the delivery process has started shall count as a pitched bag.

3. A bag that is accidentally dropped by a player before the final forward swing has started shall not be considered foul and may be picked up and pitched.

4. A bag hanging off the edge of the board has value unless it is touching the ground.

Protests - If a player desires to make a protest, the protest shall be made to the judge or official at the time the problem occurs. The judge shall make the final ruling on all protests.

LENGTH OF THE GAME

TRADITIONAL 21

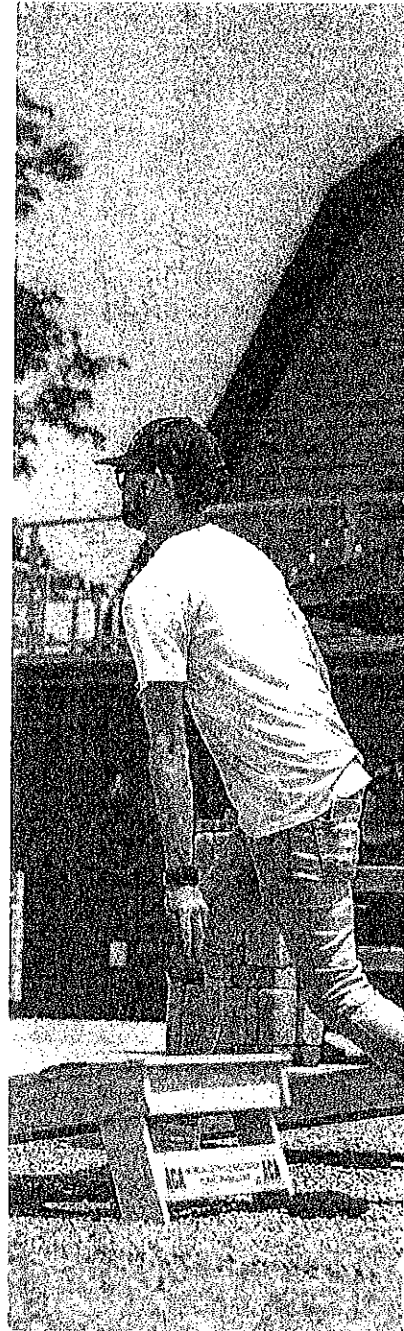
The game shall be played to the predetermined number of twenty-one points. The first player/team to reach (or exceed) that amount at the conclusion of an inning is the winner.

HOUSE RULES

NON CANCELLATION

This game mode is played like normal EXCEPT scoring doesn't cancel, instead every point is counted. The pros of this style moves the game along quicker. These games can be played with the first team to 21 wins or 21 exact.

Hi Abby,

I am attaching Cameron Pierce's proposal for tree maintenance as a result of our walk of the Green on September 22, which was presented and discussed at our Committee meeting yesterday. I now would like to move forward on producing the GIS map of the Green.

I am also attaching my update of the inventory of trees on the Green. I have been maintaining this inventory since June 2018 when it was handed down to me by a former Committee member. I do not know the origins of this inventory and I do have an inquiry out to the former Committee member.

The inventory initially was produced in a table format and my current software is not compatible so the table looks messy. Eventually I hope that this will be uploaded into a spreadsheet format which will make editing easier for whomever takes on this task for the Committee in the future. My updates are in red font and the numbers of newly planted trees are mine as well. I have checked against all of the files that were given to me, and to the best of my knowledge, these numbers have not been used in the recent past. Though we may want to establish a numbering policy/protocol.

I am copying Gary Zielinski on this email since he can provide exact dates for planting and removal of trees if this is important. Also, I will ask Gary to verify my edits, as well and update/edit as necessary. I used the Morton Arboretum as a source for botanic names. As I understand it, botanic names are for internal use and are not included on the aerial map.

Our goal was to have an updated aerial map by the end of October but that date is flexible. The goal is to ensure the accuracy of the inventory and I hope that Gary can help with that.

The map is a valuable tool for our Committee and as we move forward one of our goals will be to have this map up on the towns website and to make it interactive - perhaps with an App - so that interested persons can take a tour of our trees on the Green and to be able to identify them. Yale University has an interactive map of all trees on their properties. I will get the link for you and send it along separately. But as I say - this is a future goal!

Thanks again for your assistance on this project. Please let me know how I may be of assistance as we move forward with this project.

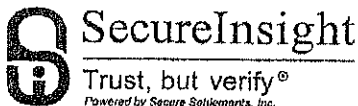


The purpose of the meeting was to review the GIS map of the Green with the Inland Wetlands Officer, establish a baseline and develop a plan to update the map going forward. The map is a guide to those who are charged with the care and maintenance of the Green including the Green Committee, the First Selectman, the town arborist, the Departments of Public Works, Park and Recreation and Inland Wetlands. The current map was produced in 2018 and is based on 2016 aerial satellite imagery. The Town is now using 2019 satellite imagery. Some topics discussed to update the map were:

1. Deleting trees that have been removed and adding new trees that have been planted;
2. Updating the key: adding new honorees, adjusting nomenclature, e.g., "honored," "sponsored," "in memory of" etc.;
3. Updating the numbering of trees for clarification;
4. Technical aspects of producing and distributing an updated map;
5. Establishing the map on the Town website for access by the public.

Attached are documents presented at the meeting which include a brief history of developments from 2017 to date and the "Town Green Inventory" map.

The meeting also helped further the relationship between the Committee and the Inland Wetlands Officer. Members of the Committee discussed the history and physical aspects of the Green and role of the Committee with Ms. York.

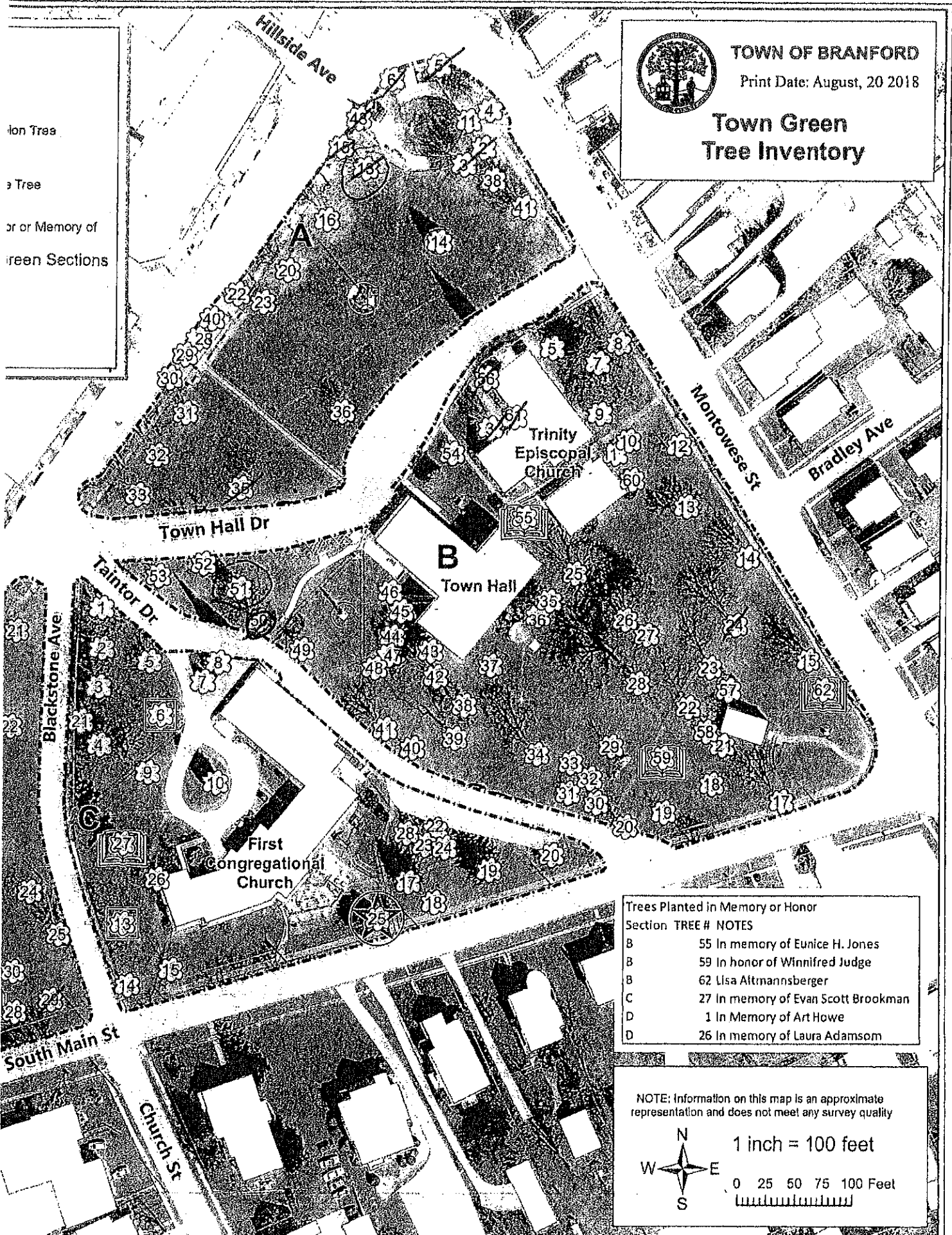

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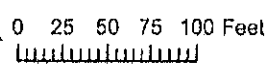

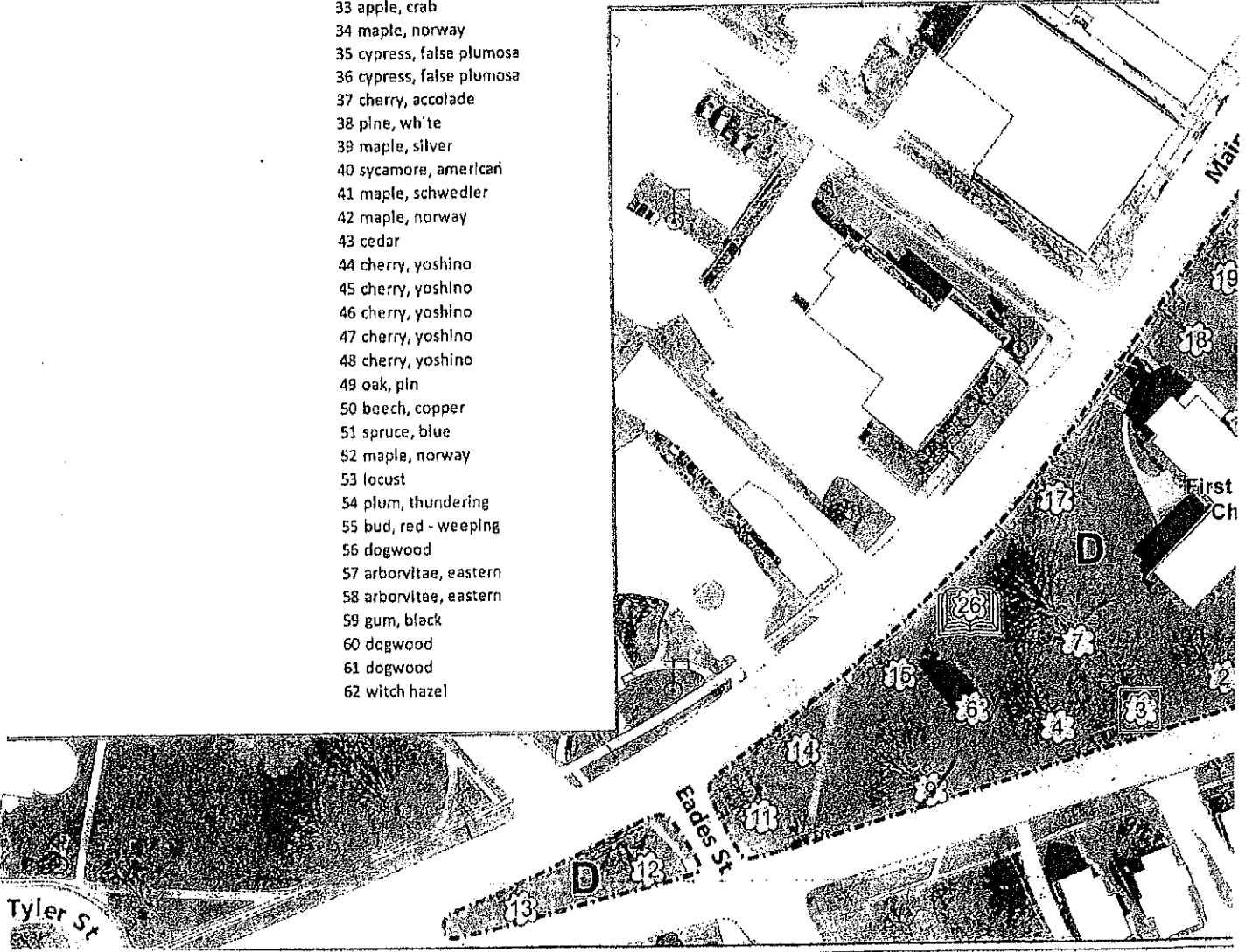

However the timing of that planting depends on many moving parts associated with the overall Main Street project. It may be in 2022 but we cannot be sure if or when.
