
The mission of the Branford Community Foundation (BCF) is to improve the wellbeing of the Branford community by connecting people who care with causes that matter, now and for generations to come.




In February 2023, the Town of Branford asked the Branford Community Foundation (BCF) to develop recommendations for distribution of an additional \$395,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to charitable organizations serving the Branford community.

- Confirm funding priorities in partnership with Town leadership
- Name ARPA review committee, ensuring broad community representation
- Create unique application
- Establish timeline





FUNDING PRIORITIES

- Organization must demonstrate <u>negative</u>

 <u>economic impact</u> created or exacerbated by COVID19.
- Basic needs, including food insecurity, shelter, emergency financial assistance, childcare.
- Consider supporting organizations and populations that are <u>disparately impacted</u> and that BCF may not have previously supported.
- Mental health services, including prevention, intervention, and substance misuse.
- Programs that **create joy** in the Branford community.
- Child and youth development services.
- Strive for high impact in the Branford community.







TIMELINE

- May 31, 2023 Public meeting targeting eligible charitable organizations serving the Branford community held at the Community House on (approximately 55 people in attendance).
- May / June / July / August Publicity regarding opportunity and deadline sent to local papers, through social media and email blasts.
- **June 28, 2023** Grantee workshop held June 28th at the Branford Fire Headquarters
- September 8, 2023 Applications due










PROCESS


SEPTEMBER – NOVEMBER 2023

- ARPA Review Committee met 7 times for training, application review, and preparing recommendations.
- Each committee member completed a confidentially and conflict of interest policy form.
- ARPA Consultant reviewed each application for eligibility under federal guidelines, any enumerated uses of State and Local recovery funds, demonstrated negative economic impact created or exacerbated by COVID19, and whether the amount requested is reasonable proportional to the extent and harm experienced.
- Each committee member reviewed each application.
- Each application received a "Lead" and a "Seconder" for review. The lead and seconder provided an overview and initial recommendation for discussion.









RECOMMENDATIONS

- Budget \$395,000
- 27 applications received requesting a total of \$579,369 (range \$2,000 to \$75,000)
- 25 grants recommended for funding (total \$395,000)
- 16 grants recommended for full funding
- 7 grants recommended for partial funding
- 1 application referred back to town for funding through different process (application from an organization not deemed charitable but worthy of funding consideration).
- 1 application not recommended for funding.
