2.Business

- a. Tree Planting. Zelinski reported that 58 new native trees have been planted this spring:
 - 15 Serviceberries
 - 15 Red Maples
 - 3 Sycamores
 - 4 Sweet Gums
 - 9 Black Gums
 - 6 Princeton Elm Trees
 - 3 American Lindens
 - 3 Multi Stem Serviceberries.

In addition, a Serviceberry was planted at Foote Park for Arbor Day and a memorial tree, a Black Gum was planted at Granite Bay Park.

b. Outreach

The Spring Tree Giveaway was a tremendous success. One hundred twenty-five trees were given to residents on Saturday, April 26th with instructions about how to plant the trees, and they were given information for their continuing care. The Forest Commission members were joined by several members of the Conservation Commission in distributing the trees.

- e. Other:

Chris Ozyck, who works for Urban Resources Initiative at Yale, has been leading work crews to devine trees in New Haven. Invasive vines are strangling trees throughout the area. We could ask to have him advise us in tree dv-vining or ask him to speak about his program. The Branford Land Trust, Parks Open Space Commission and the Conservation Commission would be good to partner with to invite him to speak. This information would be valuable to us all.
