### All:

At last night's meeting the RTM concluded that the ARPA requests were not consistently reviewed during the committee process. After a friendly discussion regarding potential remedies including the use of waiving rule 4.4 (1) the body ultimately voted to refer the ARPA items back to the Ways and Means Committee. As you may recall, the ARPA appropriation process was designed to mirror the budget approval/amendment process since it was familiar to the appropriating bodies and offered a mechanism for public discussions and input. I have attached a summary list of all of the ARPA projects/items since inception.

These projects span a variety of governmental functions: general government, public safety, public works/engineering, and human services. As a review it is important to consider the following:

- All of the projects were previously presented to the Board of Finance and transmitted to the RTM.
- Some recommendations reflect an increase over the amount requested allowing the town to enhance its service efforts without dramatically increasing the tax requirements or additional debt
- Some recommendations are linked to recommended reductions in the FY 23-24 budget approved by the RTM.
- For those projects which reflect enhanced funding and for which the town is seeking to continue beyond the ARPA funding process, the town's strategy is to provide a glide path so that the general fund increases in future years remain logical and budget sensitive.

While I don't want to be presumptuous with regard to the final ARPA outcome it is worth noting that the RTM validated the recommendations of the Board of Finance by passing the budget as presented with the exception of a recommended pension adjustment pursuant to anticipated changes in the CMERS program. My sense is that since all of the requests were previously transmitted to the RTM that this effort is designed to ensure procedural consistency and as a result the impact on the departments with ARPA projects may be minimal.
