The RTM held a **Zoom** meeting on Wednesday, September 9, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. to consider and act upon the following matters:

Review of remote meeting requirements & Roll Call

a. Moderator Flanigan read the report from Chairman of the Board of Finance from the chairman J. Mooney. The report relates to the adopted resolution for funds in the amount of \$2,895,000 to be used for the renovation and expansion of the Cosgrove Animal Shelter.

- b. Moderator Flanigan read a letter from citizen Cooke re: the Housing Authority and Parkside Village. The letter requests a full, independent, forensic audit (see attached). This item was referred to committee.
- c. Moderator Flanigan read a letter from citizen Cooke regarding the improper use of zoom meetings to censor citizen comments. Moderator Flanigan will take this under consideration and report back.
- d. Moderator Flanigan read a letter from citizen Cooke asking the RTM to monitor how the Clean Energy Committee introduces the first draft of their energy plan to the community (see attached).

4. To consider, and if appropriate, create a Blight Ordinance for the Town of Branford.

a. Rep. Black made a motion to re-refer both this item and item 5, 2nd by Rep. Sullivan. The item was unanimously re-referred.

This transfer out will be funded from the Animal Control Fund's undesignated fund balance and increase the fiscal year 2021 Animal Control Fund budget from \$367,026 to \$467,026.

 - f. The Clean Energy Committee will be involved in discussions related to making this project as "green" as possible.
 - g. Citizen Cooke raised several issues, including questions regarding 73-3 of the Town Charter (land transfers). Ist selectman Cosgrove responded stating that he believes 73-3 does not pertain to this situation.
 - h. Many attendees complimented the workers that run and volunteer at the animal shelter in less than optimal circumstances.

i. After the lengthy discussion period, this item passed unanimously with a roll call vote (see attached).

In light of recent actions undertaken by the Branford Housing Authority; the continued concerns of citizens regarding possible fraud, corruption, and embezzlement in the management of the Parkside Village complex; and the refusal of the current administration to investigate these concerns appropriately, the RTM is asked to immediately initiate a full and independent forensic audit into this matter.

Because of the nature of these circumstances and the unanswered questions surrounding them, it is emphasized that a full forensic audit and not a routine financial audit must be performed.
