Land Acquisition

I am writing to supplement First Selectman's request for an appropriation to purchase 14.5 acres at the end of Tabor Drive. This property, which is owned by the Zuwalick family, was endorsed by Selectman's Committee on Open Space Acquisitions and received a favorable 8-24 review by the Planning and Zoning Commission in October.

I anticipate the Selectman will outline the benefits of the purchase. My letter will focus exclusively on the funding requirements and the mechanical aspects of the appropriations.

## Estimated Purchase Price and Other Incidentals:

The purchase price and estimated incidentals is as follows:

Purchase Price 245,000

Other 5,000

250,000

## Funding Sources:

The revenue source for this project will be derived from a transfer out of the general fund. I propose using the balance of funds previously allocated to cover an anticipated contribution to the Teachers Retirement Board (TRB). The balance in the line item is \$377,784 after the Board moved \$1,000,000 out of the account to augment the pension fund.

## Required Actions:

If the Board fulfills the First Selectman's request the following actions are required:

- Create a transfer out line item in the General Fund for transfer into the Land Acquisition Fund
- Create an appropriation in the Land Acquisition Fund

## Land Acquisition Fund
