PROMOTE SUSTAINABILITY AND RESILIENCY

Overview

This "briefing booklet" has been prepared as part of the process of preparing an update to the 2008 Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD) for Branford. This booklet is intended to familiarize the members of the POCD Update Committee and others existing and potential future strategies related to sustainability and resiliency.

What Is "Sustainability" and "Resiliency"?

For the purposes of the POCD, "sustainability" refers to the philosophy of encouraging activities that allow present generations to meet their needs without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs.

The term "resiliency" refers to the community's ability to withstand, respond to, and readily recover from sudden changes or adversity.







Background

For the POCD, sustainability relates to being efficient and economical in our use of resources using approaches that are economically viable, of social benefit, and environmentally responsible. Some of the items to be considered as part of an overall approach to sustainability could include:

Energy-Related	Reducing energy use (and considering life-cycle costing) Becoming more efficient in use of energy resources Providing for alternative generation approaches (solar, wind, fuel cell, micro-grids, etc.)	
Water-Related	Reducing water use Reducing water waste / recycling water	
Waste-Related	Reducing waste (including food waste)Increasing recycling	

For the POCD, resiliency relates to being able to absorb and/or recover from impactful events in an efficient and timely way. The elements of being a resilient community can include:

Avoidance- Related	Identification / avoidance / risk reduction
Mitigation- Related	 Evaluating probability / risk scenarios Evaluating approaches (protection / adaptation) Balancing of cost / benefit Hardening infrastructure (e.g. burying utilities) Requiring resilient buildings in coastal areas Promoting grid independence / interconnected community
Response- Related	 Pre-event education / training Pre-event response plans

Branford has participated with adjacent communities and the South Central Regional Council of Governments on the preparation of a Hazard Mitigation Strategy to identify and then reduce or eliminate risk to human life and property resulting from recurring natural hazards such as hurricanes, flooding and winter storms. Recent hurricanes and major storm events have proven this to be a worthwhile exercise and exercises like this should continue so that Branford can be a resilient community when events like these occur in the future.
