WHAT IS STREAMING???

- a method of transmitting or receiving data (especially video and audio material) over a computer network as a steady, continuous flow, allowing playback to start while the rest of the data is still being received
- Opposite of streaming: downloading a file
 - In most cases, you'll need to wait until that file is completely downloaded and processed before you can open it
- Streaming is immediate
- Doesn't require storage space
- Need an active internet connection

LIVE STREAMING 101

- What is typically meant by "livestreaming?
 - Streaming media simultaneously recorded and broadcast in real-time over the Internet
 - Non-live media such as videos on demand (Netflix, Hulu, etc.) are technically streamed but not livestreamed
- Typically done by well-known/famous people
 - Stream daily activities, gaming, cooking, makeup tutorials
- Some streams watched by thousands of people
- Viewers can comment on live streams and they'll appear alongside the stream

- Most popular livestreaming platforms
 - Facebook Watch
 - YouTube Live
 - Instagram Live
 - Twitch
 - TikTok
 - Not just for live videos

- Need internet and a device (iPhone, PC) to livestream
 - This doesn't have to do with cutting the cord

CORD CUTTING 101

• What is cord cutting?

- "The practice of canceling or forgoing a cable television subscription...in favor of an alternative Internet-based or wireless service*"
- In place of a cable box, you add and use channels/apps through a smart TV or external device (Roku, Apple TV, Amazon Fire Stick, etc.) to access content

Benefits

- Control over what you want to watch (and when)
- No more contracts
- Quality shows & movies you might not be able to view otherwise

Downsides

- Savings may not be as drastic as they once were
- More bills to keep track of
- Difficulty getting some types of content- sports

GOOD INTERNET — A MUST

- Speeds in the neighborhood of 10 Mbps
 - May need more (15-20 Mbps) for live TV and multiple streams
 - If it's just one or two of you and you don't think you'll watch more than one stream simultaneously, you should be fine with 10 Mbps
 - Location of the router in your home, any obstructions, & age of router all play a role
- Netflix recommends 3-5 Mbps (3 for SD, 5 for HD)
- Hulu recommends 6 Mbps for HD and 8 for Hulu + Live TV
- Check your Internet speed here: https://www.speedtest.net/ or speedtest.xfinity.com
 - Test over a span of a few days, at varying times
 - Want to make sure ISP is providing the speed you're paying for; if not, call and inquire
- Will spend between \$40-\$50 a month for a basic package
 - Some will show a price of \$~30 a month but this is only for the first year

TWO OPTIONS FOR STREAMING CONTENT

Streaming Player

- Pay a one-time price for the device
- Either plug directly into TV or into HDMI cable which plugs into TV
 - Amazon Fire TV Stick 4K Max
 - Roku Express 4K Plus
 - Roku Streaming Stick 4K
 - Roku Streaming Stick 4K Plus
 - Roku Ultra
 - Apple TV 4K
 - Chromecast with Google TV
 - TiVo Stream 4K

Smart TV

- Think of it like a smartphone/iPad
- Accesses online content by connecting to your Wi-Fi network
- With a smart TV, there is no need for an external media hub
 - Channels are displayed on-screen
- Bottom line: need a new TV & don't have an external hub? Get a smart TV

STREAMING PLAYERS

- Amazon Fire TV Stick Lite <u>Best budget</u>
 <u>streamer</u>
 - \$20-\$30
 - Remote has built-in voice search
 - Doesn't need line of sight to work
 - More complex menus than Roku
- Roku Express 2nd best budget streamer
 - \$30 (often on sale for less)
 - Simple interface & searching
 - Simple remote (no voice features)
 - Offers a free content section
 - Doesn't push any one media provider

- Roku Express 4K Plus <u>Best streamer</u>
 overall
 - \$30 \$40
 - Simple interface, offers free content section
 - Voice remote w/ controls
 - Doesn't push any one media provider
- Chromecast with Google TV 2nd best overall
 - \$50
 - Now includes a remote!
 - Google Assistant voice search
 - Ties in well with YouTube TV & the Google ecosystem

LIVE TV STREAMING VS ON DEMAND STREAMING

- Live TV streaming is like traditional TV but it delivers content over the Internet
- Scroll through the channels that the service offers, choose a channel, and view whatever program is already in progress
- Examples of live TV streaming services:
 YouTube TV, Sling TV

- On demand streaming offers a library of shows and movies to watch on your schedule
- You can pause, stop, continue watching, or switch to a different show at any time
- Examples of on demand streaming services: Netflix, Disney+

IMPORTANT! Every live TV service is 30-60 seconds behind the "live" stream you'll get from your local cable or satellite provider

LIVE TV STREAMING SERVICES

YouTube TV

- \$65/month for 85+ channels
- One of only 2 that includes PBS
- Unlimited DVR storage
 - Can be kept for 9 months

Sling TV

- **Sling Orange** (33 channels- ESPN & Disney)
- Sling Blue (48 channels- NBC & Fox, NFL Network)
 - \$35/month for each on their own
 - \$50 for both
- Very few local stations
- Cloud DVR: 50 hours, 200 hours for +\$5

Hulu + Live TV

- \$70/month for 75+ channels
- NOW INCLUDES Disney+ and ESPN+
- Cloud DVR: 50 hours
- \$10 more a month to skip commercials on DVR

DirecTV Stream

- \$70/month for 65+ channels
- Cloud DVR: 20 hours; unlimited for +\$10
- Includes PBS in some cities
- \$15 more to skip commercials on DVR
- \$90 tier has access to most regional sports networks
 - Can watch regular season NBA, MLB, & NHL games

LIVE TV STREAMING SERVICES CONT.

• Philo

- \$25/month
- Entertainment and lifestyle channels (HGTV, Food Network, History Channel, Hallmark)
- No sports or local channels


Paramount Plus

- \$5/month or \$10/month with no commercials
- Lots of great shows- current seasons and complete past seasons (NCIS, Blue Bloods, Star Trek)
- Not a ton of live TV
 - CBS, MTV, BET, Comedy Central

Fubo TV

- \$65/month
- For the sports enthusiast
 - Especially soccer & football
- Now has ESPN
- Cloud DVR: 250 hours
- Includes CBS, FOX, Golf Channel, NBA TV, NBC,
 NFL Network, NASCAR, PGA Tour
- Does not include CNN, TNT & TBS
- Worth looking into free options
 - Pluto TV (CBS)
 - Roku Channel (ABC)
 - Sling TV Free (ABC News Live)
 - Peacock (small selection of live sports & news)

LIVE TV SHOPPING LIST

- Does the service offer your "must-have" channels?
- Does it offer local channels in your area?
- How good is the cloud DVR?
- Does the interface make it easy to browse for shows?
- Are there enough simultaneous streams for you and your family?
- Is your internet connection up to snuff?

NETFLIX

- \$10 for Basic
- \$15 for Standard
- \$18 for Premium
- No ads
- Top-notch original programming
- Sleek interface
- Basic plan
 - HD not available
 - Only 1 screen

HULU

- \$7 a month/\$13 with no ads
- Great selection of TV series
- Many come to Hulu day after they air on networks
- Fewer original shows than competitors
 - The Handmaid's Tale

PRIME VIDEO

- \$9 a month
- Or included with Amazon prime
 - \$13 a month or \$119 a year
- No ads
- Wide variety of movies and shows
- Can rent or buy movies and TV shows
- Not the BEST interface

DISNEY+

- \$8 per month
- No ads
- Good for families
- Tons of Disney-owned content all in one place
- Original programming
 - The Mandalorian
- Ton of Marvel, Star Wars, Pixar movies

PARAMOUNT+

- \$6
- \$10 no commercials
- Huge catalog of current and classic
 CBS shows
- CBS originals Star Trek Picard, The Good Fight
- Almost all of Nickelodeon, Comedy
 Central stand-ups, Frasier & Cheers

PEACOCK

- Free tier (ads)
- Premium for \$5 (ads)
- Premium Plus for \$10 (no ads)
- Fan favorites like The Office and Parks and Rec available only on Peacock
- Content mainly from NBCUniversal

HBO MAX

- \$10 (ads + won't have the newest movies)
- \$15
- HBO's entire catalog
- Has Friends
- Almost every Studio Ghibli film
- Selection of classics/Criterion

What options do I have for news if I don't want to subscribe to a live TV service?

OVER-THE-AIR (OTA) ANTENNA

- Indoor antenna, hooked up to your TV, that you can mount on your window or wall
- Price ranges from \$10 to about \$40
- Get live local news (depending on where you live) from ABC, CBS, Fox, NBC; most have a 30-35 mile range
- Might want to purchase a DVR to go along with the antenna, so that you can save content to watch later & skip commercials (\$150-\$300)
 - Check out CNET's <u>article on the best DVRs</u> for those using an OTA antenna
 - Be aware: depending on your proximity to broadcast towers, an OTA antenna might not work at all

FREE APPS FOR LOCAL NEWS

- NewsON available with Roku and Amazon Fire TV, also iPhones/Androids
 - Ad-supported service that offers full-length live & on-demand local newscasts from 275+ stations around the U.S.
 - Easy to navigate
- Haystack News on all major streaming devices, also iPhones/Androids
 - Ad-supported service that provides local, national, and global news from 350+ stations
 - Straightforward & customizable
- Local Now available on Roku, iPhones/Androids
 - Streams local news, weather, traffic and sports
 - Range of diverse news stories
