The day begins at Fire Arts Vermont with glass blowing & clay demonstrations.

Water front dining at The Marina where the Connecticut & West Rivers meet with beautiful views.

Luncheon choices (includes chowder, brownie w/strawberries/whipped cream & cof/tea/soda): shrimp & chip - breaded butterfly shrimp & French fries served w/cocktail or tartar sauce grilled lemon pepper tilapia sandwich - served on a country roll w/lettuce, tomato, red onion & fries vegetable quiche - generous piece of broccoli, tomato & VT cheddar quiche served with coleslaw Chicken/apple/spinach salad also includes smoked bacon bits, carrots, toasted almonds & parmesan VT cheddar mac & cheese - topped with panko bread crumbs& baked to a golden brown BBQ pulled pork sandwich - slow cooked on a country roll with fries bacon cheeseburger - half pound burger served with lettuce, tomato, onion & fries bacon chicken melt - with VT cheddar, lettuce, tomato, onion, on roll, fries & side of VT maple mayo

After lunch take a short trip to Grafton Village Cheese Factory where you can taste the handmade cheeses before making purchases. It's a VT tradition since 1892.

Final stop will be at the Creamery Covered Bridge for spectacular foliage pictures at this lattice truss landscaped bridge. This bridge is the last surviving 19th century covered bridge built out of spruce lumber.
